

A DECLARATION

To the Houses of Parliament

(House of Commons and House of Lords)

The Sovereign People of the United Kingdom

“The right to revolution – whenever the Legislators endeavour to take away, and destroy the Property of the People.....they put themselves into a state of war with the People by this breach of Trust they forfeit the Power, the People had put into their hands, for quite contrary ends, and it devolves to the People, who have a Right to resume the original Liberty”

(Locke, Two Treatises of Government)

WE, the undersigned Sovereign People of the United Kingdom, do declare that to transfer the sovereignty and powers of the United Kingdom Electorate to a foreign country or entity, without the declared assent of the United Kingdom Electorate is a breach of the Constitutional law and illegal. If all these sovereign powers are not repatriated to the United Kingdom, then those responsible for those illegal acts are accountable to the Electorate.

1. The Electorate of the United Kingdom is Sovereign.
2. The United Kingdom Electorate has delegated to the Crown and Parliament sovereign powers at dates of election, to enable them to administer the affairs of the state **internally**.
3. It is NOT within the gift of the Crown and Parliament to transfer all or any of these powers, so delegated, to a foreign country or entity, and in doing so, **externally**. This is clearly forbidden by the laws of the Constitution.
4. Parliament is subject to change by the Electorate at election dates.
5. The Transfer of Sovereignty and powers to a foreign country or entity without the clear assent of the Electorate is unconstitutional and illegal. If those sovereign powers, in part or in whole, are not repatriated to the United Kingdom, then those responsible should be held accountable as being party to a breach of the Constitution and the law relating thereto.

This Declaration must now be contained within our uncodified Constitution to confirm that Parliament has not had ever, nor at any future time will have, the power to transfer or give away the Sovereignty of the United Kingdom to a foreign country or entity without the assent of the Electorate by way of a Referendum specifically set up for that purpose.

Members of Parliament are chosen by the Electorate to **represent** them within the House of Commons. To decide upon **internal** matters of state, if the Electorate should disagree then they are able to change Parliament at a future election date. Parliament is not given carte blanche in all matters of decisions in respect of our Sovereignty.

A Referendum was held in June, 2016 regarding whether the Electorate wished to remain or leave the EU. The majority of the Electorate decided to have full Sovereignty returned to the United Kingdom and in order to facilitate this, the current Government must arrange for the United Kingdom to leave the EU in its entirety.
